BURT WOLF CRUISE ITINERARY

CRUISE DAY 1 – FRIDAY 21ST OCTOBER 2011 * DEPART U.S. FOR LYON, FRANCE

CRUISE DAY 2 – SATURDAY 22ND OCTOBER 2011 * ARRIVE LYON * BOARD SHIP

Arrive in Lyon and transfer to the ship. You can relax in your stateroom or explore the city. Burt will supply you with his tip sheet to the things he likes best in the area. This evening we will meet on-board for a drink and the Welcome Dinner with Burt, the Cruise Manager and our fellow passengers.



CRUISE DAY 3 – SUNDAY 23RD OCTOBER 2011 * LYON – TRÉVOUX

The ancient city of Lyon was founded by the Romans in the year 43. It is the second largest city in France and the nation's gastronomic capital. A guided tour will show you the Roman ruins, the Renaissance architecture and the Old Town, which is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. We return to the ship for lunch, and relax as we sail north along the Saône River to the small town of Trévoux. A guided walking tour will take us through this historic village. The former capital of the ancient principality of Dombes, the town's landmarks include a Parliament building, medieval ramparts and a hillside Chateau.

CRUISE DAY 4 – MONDAY 24TH OCTOBER 2011 * TRÉVOUX – VIENNE

After breakfast, the morning tour takes us behind the village walls of Trévoux through Beaujolais, the Pays d'Or or "land of the golden stones" named for the ochre limestone used to build the region's homes and castles. We'll stop for a visit with a local winemaker along "la route de vin" and sample the world-renowned Beaujolais Nouveau. Then we return to the ship and continue cruising south from the Saône to the Rhône river towards Vienne. We will spend the evening in this traditional rural town.



CRUISE DAY 5 – TUESDAY 25TH OCTOBER 2011 * VIENNE – TOURNON

Situated between the wine regions of Burgundy and Beaujolais, Vienne, has a significant Roman history, which is highlighted by its preserved ruins. This morning, we take a mini train tour and see the 1st century Roman Temple of Augustus and the Medieval churches of St. Andre-Le-Bas and Abbey St. Pierre, before we return to the ship and cruise on to Tournon and Tain L’Hermitage. These twin towns face each other across the Rhône River and are linked by a 19th-century suspension bridge – the oldest suspension bridge in Europe. The fertile soil and ideal climate of the region has made Tain L’Hermitage the premier producer of the Côtes du Rhône wines. We’ll have free time this afternoon to visit the 16th-century castle which is now a town hall, or visit the chocolate shop for a taste of the confections once produced in Tournon’s famous factory. After dinner we’ll have a wine tasting on-board.

CRUISE DAY 6 – WEDNESDAY 26TH OCTOBER 2011 * TOURNON – BOUCIEU-LE-ROI – VIVIERS

This morning we will get a close look at a working farm located in the midst of the Ardèche Mountains and then take a scenic tour of the valley’s beautiful landscape. We’ll stop into Boucieu-le-Roi and visit the local market well-known for its handmade crafts, musical entertainment and wine tastings. We return to the ship for lunch and then cruise to Viviers, which was built around a Romanesque Cathedral. The Old Town is a blend of Roman, Christian and Medieval influences. After dinner, we’ll have an evening “ghost walk” through the largely abandoned Medieval town. The ship moors overnight in Viviers.

CRUISE DAY 7 – THURSDAY 27TH OCTOBER 2011 * VIVIERS – AVIGNON

During the morning, we’ll cruise to Avignon, arriving in the afternoon. This fortified city is the capital of the region and one of the most picturesque parts of Provence. During the 14th century it was the residence of the Pope and his palace dominates the city’s skyline. There is a guided tour of the city and a visit to the palace. There is also an optional excursion to the Roman aqueduct of Pont du Gard, which is an amazing example of Roman engineering and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The Pont du Gard excursion also visits Uzes, a lovely Provençal town known for its Castle of the Duke of Uzes (still occupied by the Duke and his family), Medieval streets and a picturesque town square. We will have free time for shopping in Uzes.

CRUISE DAY 8 – FRIDAY 28TH OCTOBER 2011 * AVIGNON - LES BAUX – ARLES

This morning, we travel by motor coach to the village of Les Baux, which is a well-preserved example of an ancient hill town and home to one of Burt’s favorite candy stores. Arles is the capital of Provence and was once a major Roman settlement. We’ll visit the Church of St. Trophime and the ancient Roman Amphitheater. Arles and its surroundings were the inspiration for many of Van Gogh’s most famous paintings. Tonight there will be a Farewell Dinner on-board the ship. We’ll also take group and individual photographs with Burt.



**CRUISE DAY 9 – SATURDAY 29TH OCTOBER 2011 * ARLES (DISEMBARK)
TRANSFER TO AIRPORT**

After breakfast we will head to the airport for our home bound flights. Flights will arrive back in the U.S. on the same day (29th October 2011).

Arrive in Paris and transfer to your hotel. Take the balance of the day to relax or explore the city. Burt will give you his tip sheets on where to eat, drink and shop.

OPTIONAL PRE-CRUISE EXTENSION * THURSDAY 20TH OCTOBER 2011 * PARIS

This morning's motor coach tour will take you past Notre Dame Cathedral, the commemorative Arc de Triomphe, the Opéra, La Madeleine, Les Champs Elysées and more. The remainder of the day is yours to explore on your own. (Hotel Breakfast included).

OPTIONAL PRE-CRUISE EXTENSION * FRIDAY 21ST OCTOBER 2011 * PARIS

Your day in the Paris is free for you to enjoy. Go to the top of the Eiffel Tower, built for the 1889 World's Fair or choose one of the various optional tours that are available. Burt will supply you with the details for a self-guided gastronomic tour of the city. (Hotel Breakfast included).

**OPTIONAL PRE-CRUISE EXTENSION * SATURDAY 22ND OCTOBER 2011 *
PARIS – CHECK-OUT OF HOTEL – LYON – BOARD SHIP**

This afternoon, board the TGV train (top speed 186 mph) and travel in quiet comfort to Lyon. Lyon not only marks the meeting of the Saône and Rhône rivers, but it is also the gastronomic capital of France. Its rich ancient history includes Roman ruins and early Christian sites. You will have free time for lunch before attending a cooking demonstration. Afterwards, you will board the MS Swiss Pearl. You can relax in your stateroom or explore the city. Burt will supply you with his tip sheet to the things he likes best in the area. This evening we will meet on-board for a drink and the Welcome Dinner with Burt, the Cruise Manager and our fellow passengers. (Please continue viewing itinerary on "Cruise Day 3.)



OPTIONAL POST-CRUISE TOUR IN BARCELONA

OPTIONAL POST-CRUISE EXTENSION * SATURDAY 29TH OCTOBER 2011 ARLES (DISEMBARK) – BARCELONA, SPAIN – CHECK-INTO HOTEL

After breakfast on-board, you will disembark ship and transfer to Barcelona, capital of the Spanish region of Catalonia. Along the way, we will pass through Camargue on the southern coast and trace the ancient trade route linking the Atlantic and Mediterranean seas. We will stop in the medieval town of Perpignan, close to the Mediterranean, where we will have free time for lunch and exploring on our own.

OPTIONAL POST-CRUISE EXTENSION * SUNDAY 30TH OCTOBER 2011 * BARCELONA

Our first full day in Barcelona begins with a driving tour to the top of Montjuic Hill with its panoramic views of the city below. Next, we tour Placa Catalonia, and Las Ramblas, the promenade and center of Barcelona life. Later, we'll see the Expiatori Temple de la Sagrada Família, designed by the architect Antonio Gaudí. There is also a walking tour of the Barrio Gotico (Gothic Quarter), King's Square, and Tinell, the Royal Palace. (Hotel Breakfast included).

OPTIONAL POST-CRUISE EXTENSION * MONDAY 31ST OCTOBER 2011 * BARCELONA

Today is a full day at your leisure in Barcelona. You can return on your own to the markets of Las Ramblas, visit one of the many museums, or cross the port for seafood in Barceloneta. In addition, there are a number of optional tours. (Hotel Breakfast included).

OPTIONAL POST-CRUISE EXTENSION * TUESDAY 1ST NOVEMBER 2011 * CHECK-OUT OF BARCELONA HOTEL – DEPART FOR U.S.

After the included hotel breakfast, you will head to the airport for your home bound flights which will arrive back in the U.S. on the same day (1st November 2011).

PRE-CRUISE MATERIALS FROM BURT WOLF

Breakfast on-board: Start each day on-board with a champagne breakfast buffet. Choose from an assortment of breads, croissants and pastries, a variety of fresh fruit, yogurt, cereals, and smoked salmon. In addition, there are cheeses, cold cuts and local sausages, as well as a daily regional special. An array of traditional breakfast items is also available from the menu.

Lunch on-board: Start with hot or cold appetizers and soups, then choose from a selection of entrees, finish off with a dessert and complimentary cappuccino.

Dinner on-board: In the evening, there is a five-course dinner or a theme night with a selection of regional specialties. White and red wines, beer and soft drinks are complimentary throughout dinner. Specialty coffees are available at no charge throughout the day.

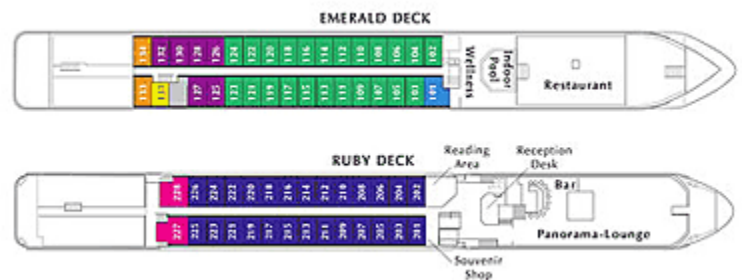
