Reserve your space now! This year's conference promises provocative and engaging topics ranging from film studies to astrobiology to sexuality in the antebellum South. As always, the Asilomar conference is a wonderful opportunity to reconnect with old friends and make new ones; to explore exciting new ideas, while revisiting familiar – but breathtaking – surroundings. If you have friends who have never joined you at this event, by all means invite them. Last year's guests commented on exhilarating conversations, inspiring presenters, delicious meals and of course the spectacular natural grounds. A weekend not to be missed.

Speakers scheduled for this year include:

Dr. Mira Kopell, (Teaching Excellence Awardee, 2013), “Dead, for a ducat, dead!” *Directing the Camera: A Study of 6 Hamlets*. J. Mira Kopell is a Professor with the UC Berkeley Department of Film and Media, and has also taught screenwriting and production at NYU's Tisch School of the Arts and The New School in New York City. This lecture explores the film director's craft by analyzing six different movie versions of the same scene from Hamlet.

Michael McGinnis, creator of the award-winning Perplexus line of games – often called “The World's Smartest Toys” – will speak about his remarkable journey from an idea to Game of The Year. Michael is a sculptor, magician, instructor of art and design at Santa Rosa Junior College, and an independent designer and curator of museum exhibits.

Dr. Margaret McLean, Director of Bioethics at the Markkula Center for Applied Ethics at Santa Clara University. Dr. McLean combines backgrounds in science and ethics that have made her a leading commentator and consultant on the ethical dimension of advances in medicine and biotechnology. Dr. McLean has written extensively on the ethical implications of genetics and cloning, and on ethical issues related to end-of-life care.

David Seaborg is an evolutionary biologist and founder / President of the World Rainforest Fund, a nonprofit foundation dedicated to saving the earth's tropical rainforests and biodiversity. His talk explores the rate of species extinction worldwide, which occurs today at 1,000 to 10,000 times the historical background rate. Seaborg identifies three main causes: habitat destruction, introduction of exotic species from one area to another, and global climate change.

Dr. Lynn Rothschild, of NASA Ames Research Center and Stanford University, has been instrumental in developing the field of [astrobiology](#). Founder of the Astrobiology Science Conferences (AbSciCon) and organizer of the first three, co-editor of the International Journal of Astrobiology, and former director of the Astrobiology Strategic Analysis and Support Office for NASA, she is currently focused on research in astrobiology and synthetic biology.

Dr. Alison Weiss, Lecturer in History at University of California, Berkeley and recipient of ΦBKNCA scholarship award for 2012. Dr. Weiss shares her research challenging the notion that antebellum interracial relationships were generally rare or at least unofficial and socially taboo.

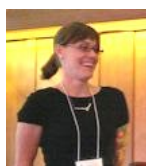
